Elkford, British Columbia is a picturesque Rocky Mountain town located near the city of Sparwood and the Alberta border. The town has approximately 2,500 residents and offers feeling of a relaxed rural community living. Citizens love the fact that they can escape the hectic urban cities, but the city of Calgary isn't too far away making it easy to find everything you need.

The area of Elkford's pristine natural wilderness is highlighted by proximity to Elk Lakes Provincial Park and Height of the Rockies Wilderness area along the continental divide. Recreational activities include world class fly-fishing on the Elk River, camping, swimming, canoeing, a local ski hill, golfing, hunting, and a full range of community recreational amenities.

Weather

The weather in Elkford is mild and does not vary a great deal between summer and winter. The temperature ranges between -15.2 and -6 degrees Celsius in the cold winter months and between 5 and 20 degrees in the summer (June-September).



Real Estate & Rental

There are several hundred vacant and fully serviced residential lots that are privately owned and are being developed over time. Housing prices are extremely low, with a two bedroom home priced at approximately \$130,000 on average. Sparwood is also within commuting distance.

Industry

Elkford's high incomes are one of the distinguishing characteristics of the community. This is mainly due to the town's primary industry, mining. The coal mines have created one of the strongest resource-



based economies in BC. The residents and coal mines take great pride in knowing that their backyard Utopia has remained largely unspoiled, with all mines in the Elk Valley taking radical steps at reclamation to ensure that they restore the natural beauty of the area to its pre-mining splendor. Many Albertan's come to Elkford to get away from city life making tourism a secondary industry.



Medical

The Elkford Health Care Centre is a fully-equipped health care center with 2 full time doctors (with hospital privileges), nursing staff, lab and x-ray services, a part time physiotherapist, and visiting public health services, drug and alcohol counselors, mental health and youth outreach workers. A doctor is available for after-hour life threatening emergency services on an on-call basis three nights a week, with nurses available during four-hour shifts on the weekend. All other after hour emergencies are handled by the Sparwood Medical Centre.
